A Reminder of God's Faithfulness from Mary Kruk

Last year, about the middle of November my little dog, Herman & I had the most amazing day. To say that God had directed our day would be an understatement as He has His hand on all of our days, but this one was undeniable. First, let me tell you a bit about Herman. He is a rescue dog that I have had for 8 years, after a couple found him running along a country road north of Saskatoon. He was dragging one of his back legs. They were able to get him into their car & take him to a veterinarian in Saskatoon. The vet had to amputate his leg & found gunshot in it. She figured that Herman had been running for a couple of weeks, so he's a tough little guy.

Fast forward to last November. It was a Wednesday afternoon & I could tell that Herman wasn't feeling well, so I called the vet but couldn't get in until Friday. By then his cheek was swollen and his eye was pushed off center, this poor little guy didn't deserve any more pain. The vet determined that he had an abscess at the back of his mouth & would need surgery. She gave me a quote on what it would cost & told me she would phone later when I could pick him up.

Now for the remarkable part of the story! With scheduled donations to charities, I wondered how I would pay for Herman's surgery so on the way to the vet I asked the Lord to help me out with this. He is helping & guiding us all the time, but this was the most recognizable time for me. I got home and about a half hour later the phone rang and it was a call, a real voice, telling me that I had \$400 available in the travel part of my MasterCard. Then about 15 minutes later the doorbell rang & a fellow from Valley Gravel sales gave me \$85.00 cash as a refund for a load of rocks that I had had delivered about 2 months earlier. Then I headed down to my mailbox & found 2 rebate cheques that I had totally forgotten about. Adding it up, it covered the bill for Herman! Later that day I went to pick up my little friend... his surgery was successful... thanking our gracious God on the drive there. Now if you know anything about vets, usually the final price is more than the quote & the bill increased by \$200. I got home with my little buddy & was bringing him up the stairs & there was \$200.00 tucked under my doormat! Wow, God is so good!
